



The Health Center will be offering first or second doses of the Pfizer COVID vaccine on the following dates. To schedule a COVID vaccine on campus, students can schedule online in the patient portal <https://carrollu.medicatconnect.com/> by choosing COVID vaccine as the reason code, or they can call 262-524-7233:

- Wednesday, September 29th 11am-1pm
- Thursdays, October 7th, and October 14th 2pm-4:30pm
- Wednesday, October 20th 2pm-4:30pm
- Thursdays, November 4th, November 11th, and 18th 2pm-4:30pm
- Thursdays, December 2nd, December 9th, and December 16th 2pm-4:30pm

COVID-19 vaccine booster doses at mass vaccination clinics will likely be offered later in the Fall semester, more information will be coming soon.

The COVID-19 vaccine is highly recommended but not required. Please note that students that are fully vaccinated for COVID-19 are not required to have mandatory COVID-19 testing prior to move in or weekly COVID testing during the academic year. Students who are fully vaccinated also will not need to quarantine if they are exposed (as long as they remain asymptomatic). Student athletes who are fully vaccinated will not need to have regular COVID testing for participation. Please note, COVID testing and masking policies are subject to change based upon Waukesha Public Health, Wisconsin Department of Health Services, and CDC guidelines as well as COVID vaccine transmission rates in the Carroll Community and local Waukesha Community.

If you have received the COVID vaccine, log into the Mediat patient portal <https://carrollu.medicatconnect.com/> and upload a copy of your COVID-19 vaccination card under the upload tab so that the information can be verified.
