

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PERSONAL COUNSELING

Individual counseling sessions

Being a college student is exciting but we know it can be challenging, too. At the Walter Young Center, we have licensed professional counselors who can help.

Common concerns include:

- Homesickness
- Relationship issues
- A change in mood
- A need to be more assertive
- Feeling overwhelmed or stressed
- Feeling anxious and/or depressed

Our counselors will help with issues that can be resolved with short-term, solution-focused counseling. If the issue is more serious, our staff will work to find the best community resources.

CONFIDENTIALITY

Counseling and disability records are kept separate from academic, disciplinary and medical records to ensure each student's privacy and confidentiality. No information is released without the knowledge and written consent of the student, except for those rare instances where counselors are required by law to reveal particular information. In an emergency, where students demonstrate a high probability of harming themselves or others, the staff might be required to release information to ensure safety.

DISABILITY SERVICES
