Dear Carroll University Student/Parent,

Wisconsin Act 61 requires the University to provide information to students and parents about meningococcal disease and hepatitis B and the availability and effectiveness of vaccines.

Please review the attached information regarding meningococcal disease and hepatitis B disease and vaccines. Please note that in addition to the Meningococcal Quadrivalent vaccine that has been out for years, there are now additional Serogroup B Meningococcal vaccines that came out in 2014 that may be administered to adolescents and young adults 16–23 years of age for short term protection (preferred age 16–18). Contact your primary care provider if you have questions. If you have already received these vaccines, please include the dates you were vaccinated on your Health History Form.

The above vaccines are available at the Carroll University Student Health Center. For students who enroll in the University sponsored student health insurance plan, all vaccines are covered at 100% if provided in the Student Health Center. For students with private insurance, we recommend that students receive the vaccines at their regular clinic since they are usually covered by most insurance companies if given by an in network provider/clinic.
