



Sexual Exploitation¹

Sexual Exploitation occurs when an individual takes non-consensual or abusive sexual advantage of another for the actor's own advantage or benefit, or to benefit or advantage anyone other than the one being exploited, and that behavior does not otherwise constitute one of the other sexual misconduct offenses.

Examples of sexual exploitation include but are not limited to:

- Invasion of sexual privacy
- Prostituting another student
- Photographing, video-taping or audio-taping of sexual activity or of a nude or partially nude person without consent
- Engaging in voyeurism
 - “The activity of getting pleasure from secretly watching other people in sexual situations, or more generally, from watching other people’s private lives”²
- Knowingly transmitting an STI or HIV to another student
- Exposing one’s genitals in non-consensual circumstances and/or inducing another to expose their genitals
- Sexually-based stalking and/or bullying.
